Goals:

- Justify project delays caused by weather events in a hurricane-prone area by providing historical weather data for specific dates and times.
- Allow external stakeholders in different locations to engage and access the live camera feed for improved project visibility and collaboration.

The <u>Liberation Pavilion</u> is the final installment in the expansion of the National WWII Museum in New Orleans, Louisiana.

This six-story addition explores the closing months of the war and immediate postwar years, concluding with an explanation of links to our lives today. The first floor, Liberation, provides visitors with opportunities to contemplate the joys, costs, and meaning of liberation and freedom. The other levels focus on what the war means today, with exhibits developed through the lens of democracy and freedom.

The first floor and parade grounds were completed in November 2022 in time for the first-ever Expressions of America experience. <u>Expressions of America</u> will be a permanent event at The National World War II Museum, starting Veterans Day 2022 and consisting of a nighttime sound and light experience immersing audiences in reflections of World War II veterans.
